Provides follow up information and any further investigation that may be necessary about domestic violence incidents along with information on restraining / protective orders and domestic violence related law enforcement issues.

May assist the victim with transportation, domestic stand-bys, and referral to community resources.

Domestic Violence Safety Tips:

- Always have an emergency plan.
- Keep money hidden to get away quickly.
- Make copies of house and car keys and keep them hidden.
- Have a list of emergency phone numbers in a safe place.
- Store extra clothing for yourself and children at a friends, relatives or neighbors residence.
- Inform someone you trust of the domestic violence who will call police if they hear a suspicious noise coming from your residence.
- Teach children how to dial 9-1-1.
- Use code words with your children and friends so they will know when to call for help.

What can these agencies do to assist victims of Domestic Violence?

District Attorney's Office Domestic Violence Unit: Assists victim's by preparing them for the court process and serves as liaison to the prosecutor.

Clerk of Court: Processes restraining / protective orders (50-B) and processes such requests through the court system.

Family Services: Assists with safety planning and risk assessment.

Department of Social Services (DSS):

Assists victims with the application process for services such as Food Stamps, Medicaid, Child Support Enforcement and Work First

Safe on Seven: Service Center for victims of domestic violence. Provides key service providers such as law enforcement, victim advocated, legal advocates and social services.

Forsyth County Sheriff's Office:

Provides information to victims on the status of restraining / protective orders and domestic violence related law enforcement issues.
